



## Summer Camp Counselors

Seeking candidates who are at least 15 years old and hold a lifeguard certification. We will offer lifeguard certification courses during the first two weekends of May. We are encouraging the existing lifeguarding staff to apply as camp counselors.

Dates of the camp will run the weeks of June 17<sup>th</sup> through August 23<sup>rd</sup>, meeting Mondays through Fridays. Staff will be scheduled weekly based on experience and availability. Those available for the majority of the weeks will get priority. The goal is to provide a core group of counselors that can perform as a team but not to demand that everyone work every weekday for ten weeks.

The camp runs with three different time slots for campers. We have an AM, PM, and an all-day option for campers. The working hours for the camp are 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM. Checking in and checking out campers throughout the day.

Candidates will be responsible for supervising campers, leading activities, resolving conflict, and providing a good role model for our young campers.

Counselors will lead in water activities, craft projects, Snack time, and sport/court activities (including wiffle ball, basketball, tennis, etc.)

Counselors are expected to interact with the campers and participate in water activities.

Counselors will interact with lifeguards, assistant manager staff, and members to accommodate daily activities and utilize space. Counselors will be under the supervision of the head counselor for the week. Head counselors are to report to the manager on duty for any issues.

Required Certifications:

- CPR, Lifeguarding, and First Aid (the Club offers a class in May for certification)
- Strong and professional interpersonal/communication skills to interact with children and parents.
- Ability to meet the physical requirements of the job including leading activities and moving camp equipment
- Willing to work all or a majority of the weeks camp is offered mid-June through August.
- Able to work up to 35-40 hours per week during busy periods at the pool
